



Health Care Coverage for Immigrants in Minnesota

- ✓ The new health law significantly expanded health coverage options for immigrants.
- ✓ Immigrants who have lawful status or employment authorization are required to get health insurance to avoid tax penalties.
- ✓ Lawful Permanent Residents ("green card" holders), immigrants on Temporary Protected Status (TPS), U-Visa, asylum applicants, and other statuses, are eligible for coverage.
- ✓ Applying for health insurance will not harm your chances of becoming a citizen or a getting a "green card" (unless receiving MA long term care in an institution).
- ✓ Undocumented immigrants/
 Deferred Action for Childhood Arrival status
 (DACA or DREAMers) are not eligible for
 health coverage. Pregnant women who are
 undocumented or have DACA status may be
 eligible for Medical Assistance depending on
 their income level and household size.
- ✓ When you apply, information about your immigration status will not be used for immigration enforcement purposes.
- ✓ Only the person applying to receive health insurance is required to show a social security number and immigration status.



I missed the March 31 deadline. How do I get health insurance?

- You have limited income
 If you or someone in your family is eligible for public assistance programs such as Medical Assistance or MinnesotaCare, you can enroll at any time during the year.
- You had a change in your insurance or family You may still be eligible for health coverage if you recently got married, had a child, lost coverage because of a divorce or job loss, had a change in your immigration status, or another life change.
